3 **4. IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION**

4 Motorcycles require precision maintenance and repairs for safe operation, especially at highway
5 speeds. Unlicensed motorcycle repair operations may pose safety risks because they are not
6 subject to regulatory oversight, licensing requirements, or mandatory insurance that protect
7 consumers. If you have concerns about work performed on your motorcycle, you may wish to
8 have it inspected by a licensed automotive repair dealer.

9 **5. POTENTIAL CONSUMER RIGHTS UNDER CALIFORNIA LAW**

10 California Business and Professions Code section 9884.6(a) makes it unlawful to operate as an
11 automotive repair dealer without proper licensing. Contracts for services performed by unlicensed
12 operators may be void or unenforceable under California law.

13 Consumers who paid unlicensed operators may have rights to seek restitution under California's
14 consumer protection laws, including the Consumers Legal Remedies Act (Civil Code § 1781) and
15 Unfair Competition Law (Business and Professions Code § 17200).

16 6. Additionally, unlicensed operators cannot lawfully:

- 17 • Charge storage fees, assert mechanic's liens or sue on a contract for motor vehicle repairs
18 (Cal. Bus. & Prof. Code § 9884.16)
- 19 • Provide valid warranties on parts or labor
- 20 • Offer consumer protections required of licensed dealers (Cal. Bus. & Prof. Code § 9884.9)

21 7. These are general statements about California consumer protection law. Individual
22 circumstances vary, and this notice does not guarantee any specific outcome or recovery amount.

23 **8. WHAT THIS NOTICE DOES NOT MEAN**

- 24 • The court has NOT certified a class action
- 25 • The court has NOT determined that any laws were violated
- 26 • This lawsuit has NOT been decided
- 27 • You are NOT automatically represented by any attorney

- You are NOT required to take any action
- No money or benefits are currently available

9. PRESERVE YOUR RECORDS

Whether or not you choose to participate in this litigation, you may wish to preserve documents related to your dealings with SoCal SuperBikes, including:

- Receipts, invoices, or payment records
- Written estimates or work orders
- Communications (texts, emails, voicemails)
- Before/after photographs of your motorcycle
- Records of subsequent repairs or inspections

These records may be important for understanding your consumer rights under California law.

10. YOUR OPTIONS

You have several options:

- i) Do nothing at this time
- ii) Contact counsel listed below, that filed this lawsuit for more information
- iii) Consult with your own attorney about your individual situation
- iv) Monitor the case through public court records

If you choose to contact counsel that filed this lawsuit, there is no obligation to participate in the lawsuit.
